Your Fire - My smelly washing!

We all have too much rubbish these days but while it's great for you to dispose of that rubbish in a garden fire, the fumes have an adverse effect on your neighbours – those close by and those in the vicinity.

Your neighbours cannot leave washing out to dry, leave a window open, enjoy a barbecue or simply garden because of you and your inconsiderate attitude.

Please think of others before deciding to have a garden fire!

According to GOV.UK

"You cannot get rid of household waste if it will cause pollution or harm people's health. This includes burning it. You can get rid of household or garden waste by composting or recycling it. Contact your local council to find out how to dispose of garden waste and about recycling in your area."

"Complain about a neighbour's bonfire. Your council can issue an 'abatement notice' if a neighbour's bonfire is causing a nuisance. A bonfire must happen frequently to be considered a nuisance. Your neighbour can be fined up to $\pounds 5,000$ if they don't follow the rules of the notice."

Speed Watch

Over the next few months we plan to carry out more Speed-Watch sessions as we cannot to push to meet three objectives (1) Create a Culture Change where people who live in the village show more respect for other road users, pedestrians and animals (2) To gather enough data to get speed controls in place (3) To push for Formal Speed Checks.

We have enough data to act on (2) and have asked the EYRC for speed survey (Strips) on Meaux Road, Sutton Road and Main Street.

We have asked the EYRC about changes to flashing Speed Signs in the hope that we can download data from improved signs - this way we will get a better picture of speeds through the village.

Emergency Plan:

In the event of a major problem (floods, gas leaks etc.) the Emergency Plan will enable the emergency services to contact the right people, meet at the designated place and look after anyone the village who has any additional needs.

Once we have the plan, we'll let you know what to do if such an emergency occurs - where to meet, what to take with you (medicines etc.), what to do with pets etc.

Traffic Controls

We have a number of issues that we plan to bundle together under one single heading - Traffic controls

- Speed Watch We plan to undertake more Speed Watch session in order to gather enough data for further action to be taken.
- Sutton Road Bridge We are currently in discussions with ERYC to see what can be done.
- Speed Calming We don't want it but if people don't slow down, particularly on Meaux Road there could be a serious accident.
- Speed Survey We have asked ERYC to update the figures they are using as we don't think they represent the current road use situation.

CCTV

Having met the expert from the EYRC regarding the regulations covering CCTV and the legal implication around the way images are retrieved and stored we have decided not to go ahead with CCTV at the first bend along Meaux Road.

Part of the Recreation Ground refurbishment plan is to include comprehensive CCTV coverage and we feel this will be a better utilisation of our funds.

Dog Fouling

The area just behind the Village Hall is not open fields – its land cared for the Village Hall committee so please don't allow you dog to foul this area.

We have installed a waste bin and dog poo bag dispenser in this area to help those of you that have forgotten to take bags with you.



Recreation Ground

There are many names for the land along Ferry Road - 'Cricket Field' (you must be over 40!) the Play Area etc.

With our plans for fresh start we want to start referring to this as the Recreation Ground – the site needs to be more inclusive, more widely used and encompass the traditional role of a sport area in a more modern way – an outside gymnasium for all ages!

We have a short and long term plans

- Spend precept or grant monies and get the play area back open in July/ August
- Spend grant monies and commuted sums (monies linked to the new build sites) to revamp the whole site

We have a sub-committee planning out the new site and applying for the funding from the many sources available.


We need to have a plan to go before the EYRC funding body in November this year - the sub-committee is aiming for work to start early 2020 but completion may have to be in any number of phases depending on how the monies are made available.

Ideas so far - Move the play area to the main field and update with CCTV, climbing frames, zipwire, roundabout, seesaw, picnic area, bins, seating, etc. a dog park, a woodland, wood sculptures, goal post, games area (football, basketball, tennis) lighting, an outdoor gym and pavements to the ground itself.

If you have a spare £100,000 please get in touch with Councillor Jacob Birch who is Chairman of the sub-committee on behalf of the Parish Council.

On the following pages you will see some provisional designs and plans. These are drafts put together to help the Sub - Committee see what the Recreatio Ground could look like.



Lancaster Bomber Flypast

Great news! We have recently been informed that we will be getting a flypast by the only flying Lancaster Bomber in the UK from the Battle of Britain Memorial Flight. It is certainly something not to miss so come to the Fest and if you can please publicise it via your social media contacts. It will be a fantastic sight and sound.

"The Royal Air Force Battle of Britain Memorial Flight (BBMF) operates from RAF Coningsby, a Typhoon and fighter base, in Lincolnshire. The mission of the RAF BBMF is to maintain the priceless artefacts of our national heritage in airworthy condition in order to commemorate those who have fallen in the service of this country, to promote the modern day Air Force and to inspire the future generations.

Flown by regular serving RAF Aircrew, the Flight operates six Spitfires, two Hurricane Mk 2Cs, a Lancaster as well as a C47 Dakota and two Chipmunk aircraft (primarily used for training).

From May to September each year, these aircraft can be regularly seen in the skies over the UK celebrating and commemorating public (Wawne Fest!!) and military events from State occasions such as Trooping the Colour to major air displays and simple flypasts for public events. We are proud to have HRH Prince William, Duke of Cambridge as our Patron.

The motto of the RAF BBMF reflects our mission and honours the thousands of men and women, in the air and on the ground, that gave their lives for this country in the noble pursuit of freedom."

I always find it humbling to go into St Peter's and think of the people who, over 900 years, have come into the church, found renewed strength through their faith, and have loved and cared for the church, passing it on to the next generation. It's a physical testimony to their faith.

In the churchyard the stonemason is still in the process of adding the name of Arthur Bromby to GW Brown's War Memorial, and we plan to have a dedication of the memorial when complete. And on the subject of war, now that we have a flagpole on the ground again, instead of only on top of the tower, we fly flags at important church or national dates. So for instance, thanks to Derek Brown in the village, the Union Jack flew recently for the D Day anniversary.

I gather that some people did not receive the Gazette last month, so I am repeating my request for anyone to contact me who would like to help keep the churchyard smart. You could do as much or as little as you fancy!


We are still awaiting the double yellow lines along the road outside the church. We were promised these two years ago, and look forward to their arrival as we want to avoid traffic flow problems because of special church services. In the meantime, we put out cones and I even ask people to move their cars if they are parked inconveniently. We are on your side!

We have a service in church virtually every Sunday at 11am, and for those who find Sundays difficult, we have one on the first Wednesday of each month at 9.30am. And in July we are holding a Cream Tea event again, in church or on the lawn in the sun outside, on Saturday 6 June from 2.30 to 4.30pm. We hope that it will be accompanied by an exhibition of paintings of East Riding churches, by Jan Tomlinson.

Joyce Yates' Brownies

Many people admired the brownies after Joyce's funeral. They were made to her recipe, so here it is, from Gabrielle:

7 oz self raising flour

4 oz dark brown sugar

3 oz margarine

3 oz black treacle

1 egg beaten with 3 fl oz milk.

Melt the sugar, marg and treacle together (either in a microwave taking care not to burn the sugar/treacle) or in a pan on a hob over a low heat, then beat in the egg and milk and stir in the flour.

Bake at 325 F (160 C) for approx 35 mins or until the cake springs back when pushed with a finger!

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
