The Parish Council would like to express its thanks to Councillor Gail Jennison who has had to leave us due to increased family commitments.

Cllr Jennison was a definite asset to the council and will be sadly missed – unless we can get her to help us with the Christmas celebrations.

A Warm Welcome

The parish council would like to welcome Councillor Pauline Steer.

Cllr Steer was already a member of the Recreation Ground subcommittee but after attending the parish council meetings on three or four occasions decided she could be of even more use to the village as a whole and joined us at the September meeting.

Recreation Ground

The sub-committee has a number of options, but in order to meet the criteria, for many of the grants available they are now having to get at least three quotes for each option.

The sub-committee are working with various suppliers on two main areas 1) keeping the "Play Area" where it currently is and developing that site or, 2) moving the "Play Area" onto the larger field, along with the additional developments the committee wish to make.

Ideas currently being looked at are:

- Better Play Park Area
- Multi Gym
- Nature Area
- Picnic Area
- Improved Goals/ Pitch
- Accessible equipment for wheel Chairs and Buggies

Traffic Controls

We have a number of issues that we plan to bundle together under one single heading – traffic controls:

- Speed-Watch - We have booked in three more sessions and with help of volunteers from the village. PCSO Bainton will be supporting the parish council to gather more data and to remind drivers about the speed limit in the village.

- Sutton Road Bridge - We are still discussing what steps we can take as well as working with East Riding Council with what options are open to us.

- Speed Survey - We are pushing the East Riding Council for a date when they plan to can carry out a speed survey across the village.

Parking Restrictions

The parking restrictions along Main Street and outside of the church have been laid down by East Riding Council.

Many people are confused by the 'spaces' in the parking restrictions and feel that some people have been given special privileges – this is not the case. During our consultation process, we met with the local traffic police who advised us that a clear road would actually lead to more speeding and that we should continue to have parking that slowed down traffic in the village.

You will also note that the parking restrictions down Ferry Road have altered slightly. This is at the request of a severely disabled resident who struggles to get out of their driveway. Cllr Birch, who has asked for this change, hopes that this will stop people parking opposite and across thier drive, allowing the resident easy access.

Christmas

As usual the Parish Council are working hard on the Christmas Festivities. We will be having the Light Switch On taking place on Friday 6th December, as normal we are meeting in the Village Hall at 5pm.

We are sure that there will be lots of other Christmas events happening around the village, so keep your eyes peeled.

We had our Annual General Meeting (AGM) on Monday 9th September and elected the new committee – Chair– Martin Benge, Vice Chair– John O'Donoghue, Secretary– Janet Benge, Treasurer– Michelle Lount with committee members; Margaret Hodgson, Edith Shipley, Gill Leng, Dean McGuigan, Elaine Shiels, David Shiels, and Chris Shipley.

We are very pleased to welcome new members to the committee – David and Anna Parker. I am also pleased to announce that some FOWSA members also want to attend the meetings and they will be invited to the meetings.

After the AGM we held our normal committee meeting, discussing the last Fest and started to plan and prepare next year's Fest which will take place on Saturday 11th July 2020 commencing at 1pm at Wawne Primary School.

As stated in the September Gazette the Fest was a great success from the many positive comments we received and we hope to build on that success. The Treasurer provided a report which showed that the Fest cost £4,242.88 to stage (school hire, stage hire, insurance, licenses, alcohol/soft drinks purchase, entertainers, skip hire, equipment testing, other sundry items) with income of £4,363.93 (Entrance fees, bar, food vendor fees, donations, raffles, tombola etc) leaving an excess of £121.05 which will be invested in the next Fest.

As I have stated in this publication before the Fest has to be selffinancing as we are an independent voluntary group. No one receives any payment and we are responsible for the financial success or failure of the event. Although we made a 'profit' it was a very small margin which could have easily turned into a loss if the weather had not been so good or if less villagers had attended. We depend on you attending and financially supporting the event. This is a village show and we welcome your comments and suggestions. What did you like / not like about the last Fest? Do you have any suggestions for entertainment? Do you have a classic car / motorbike / tractor / equipment you would like to display or do you know of any? How can we improve the Fest?

A suggestion has been made that, due to numerous comments from villagers, that a night event is held on the evening of the Fest. For us to determine if this is feasible we need to know if you would support such an event which would potentially include a live band, disco and food. Would you like to bring children? Dear Readers of the Gazette,

Most of you will know about the lead theft we suffered from the roof of St Peter's on the night of Friday 27th September 5 tons was taken in a slick operation, and we were just one of 5 churches that suffered in a short time.

Of course, the police have been involved but we are still hoping for more information. The lead was loaded onto a van/s to be taken away, and it seems that the van was parked in the road by the churchyard wall under the yew tree opposite the Home Farm garden ie between the church gate and the entrance to the allotments. Since there is really only one entrance to the village, it would seem strange if nobody drove past, whatever time of night it was.

If you saw anything, please do get in touch with me (my phone number and email address are below). Fortunately, owing to the kindness of a Wawne resident who knows some builders, the roof was temporarily covered very quickly. We are now looking to repair the roof (with stainless steel, the architect now tells me).

Several people have offered financial help, and donations towards our Fabric Fund would be wonderful, but we did receive a legacy last year towards the fabric of the church, so we hope that that will help. The support from so many has been MARVELLOUS. Thank you!

We were already looking into installing cameras to guard against metal theft, and we are continuing with this.

We are delighted that the yellow lines have now been painted outside the church. We had asked for these to prevent traffic problems when there were large services in church. I see that yellow lines have appeared in many places in the village; we only requested those outside the church. For the rest of this year, we have decided to support a small charity called The Book Bus. You can look it up on the internet if you wish; it promotes literacy in Zambia, Malawi and Ecuador by sending buses full of books and reading materials round remote areas. If anyone would like to donate (money, not books!), please give your donations to a church member.

The church will be open as usual on 31 October from about 5-7pm to offer free refreshments to all those going Trick or Treating round the village. And we will hold our normal Remembrance Service on Sunday 10 November, starting at 10.50am for the Act of Remembrance.

Looking ahead, we will be involved as usual in singing carols round the Christmas Tree on Friday 6 December at 5pm in the Village Hall, followed by refreshments in church, courtesy of the Parish Council.

Christmas Crime Prevention Advice

When at home:

- If going out, leave a light on so it looks like someone is home.
- Don't advertise to thieves what you have in your home hide your presents and only put them under the tree on Christmas Eve.
- Store presents in a safe place and be mindful how you dispose of discarded present boxes as this is a giveaway as to what is inside your home.
- Keep windows and doors locked.
- Never leave a spare key in a convenient hiding place such as under the doormat, burglars know all the usual hiding places.
- Never leave your house or car keys in or near a door or window.
- Be vigilant to heating oil thefts check levels frequently and fit a good quality locking device to all fuel tanks; consider appropriate lighting around the tank so you can see and anyone else can be seen.

When out shopping:

- Keep your purse, wallet, keys and mobile phone safe by securing them in an inside pocket or zip them away in your bag and keep it close to your body.
- Cover your PIN when making payment by card and be mindful of the amount of cash you are carrying on you.
- Never leave valuables or purchases unattended.

When using your vehicle:

- Do not drink and drive. Know your limits.
- Ensure you carry out weekly car safety checks to ensure your lights and wiper blades are in good working order and your tyre tread is sufficient. Lights on, wipers on!
- Remember to lock your vehicle and do not leave valuables on display, including your Sat Nav.
- Park in well-lit areas.

SPICY JACKET POTATOES

2 Large Baking Potatoes 1 teaspoon Sunflower oil 1 teaspoon ground cumin Half teaspoon turmeric 1 Small Onion chopped Half teaspoon ground ginger 1 teaspoon ground coriander Pinch of Garlic Salt Natural Yogurt and Parsley to Serve

1. Preheat oven to 190/375/Gas 5 . Prick the potatoes with fork and bake for 40 minutes or until soft.

2. Cut the potatoes in half and scoop out the flesh. Heat the oil in a non-stick pan and fry the onion for a few minutes to soften. Stir in the ginger, cumin, coriander and turmeric.

3. Stir over a gentle heat for about 2 minutes, then add the potato flesh, garlic salt to taste.

4. Cook the potato flesh for a further 2 minutes stirring occasionally. Spoon back into potato shells and top each with a spoonful of yogurt and a sprig of parsley.
