

SALMON PASTA WITH PARSLEY SAUCE Serves 4

450g/11b Salmon Fillet - Skinned
225g/8oz Pasta eg penne
175g/6oz Cherry Tomatoes - Halved
150ml/ quarter pint Low Fat crème fraiche
3 tablespoons finely chopped parsley
Finely grated rind of half an orange
Salt and ground black pepper

- 1. Cut Salmon into bite sized pieces, arrange on a heatproof plate and cover with foil.
- 2. Bring a large saucepan of salted water to the boil, add the pasta and return to boil. Place the plate of Salmon on top of the pan simmer for 10 to 12 mins until the pasta and salmon are cooked.
- 3. Drain the pasta and toss with the Salmon and tomatoes Mix together the Crème Fraiche, parsley, orange rind and pepper to taste, then toss into the Salmon and pasta.
- 4. Serve hot or leave to cool to room temperature.

Fish Balls in Tomato Sauce

450g/ 11b White Fish - skinned
4 tablespoons brown breadcrumbs
2 tablespoons snipes chives or spring onions
400g/ 14oz can chopped tomatoes
50g/2oz sliced button mushrooms
Salt and Ground black pepper

- 1. Cut the fish into chunks, place in food processor. Add the breadcrumbs, chives or spring onions . season and process until the fish is chopped but still with some texture
- 2. Divide into 16 even sized pieces and roll into balls.
- 3. Place the tomatoes and mushrooms in a large saucepan and cook over a medium heat until boiling. Add the fish balls, cover and simmer for 10 mins until cooked. Serve hot.

Your Parish Council

Flooding

We are in contact with the East Riding and Holderness Draining Board but have yet to hear back about our five-point action plan around identification, current status and enforcement.

We have now written to the Chair of the board and engaged with one of the three Ward Councillors as Cllr. John Holtby is a member of the board and should be able to help clarify our case.

Traffic Controls

Speed-Watch

We have held more sessions with the support of PCSO Bainton and formal letters have been sent out by the police to people going over 30mph.

We are concerned that the speed watch events are not taking place with enough regularity and have started to work with the Police and Crime Commissioners Office to agree training dates, equipment costs etc. that will allow us to carry out the sessions without PCSO Bainton.

Speed-Control

We have sent a further letter and photographs of the car badly damaged in the rear end shunt at the bridge to Sutton.

We have asked the EYRC for prices to 'lift' the levels of the road at the junction into the village and along Main Street at Church and Glebe road - we doubt that the EYRC will help financially and it will be down to the village to decide what they want to happen.

Speed Survey

The 2020 Speed Survey is complete and although the data does show that we have vehicles that speed through the village the percentage is low and as such the EYRC will not help us tackle the problem.

Double Yellow lines

Just to let you know that the EYRC enforcement team are actively pursuing those that ignore the double yellow lines – three tickets have been issues to individuals in Oak Square.

The 'Developments'

For anyone living along or walking down Ferry Road the total lack of concern from the developers remains a worry.

Many of the rules put in place to ensure that the developers could load/unload on the site continue to be ignored.

Many of the rules put in place to ensure that the roads/pavements were in place before the development started, were not enforced by the EYRC. Members of the Parish Council have held a site meeting with representatives of the EYRC and we have agreed a way forward that should lead to improvements in the way that the site is managed/policed.

Recreation Ground

We now have the necessary agreements in place and we are happy that our planned regeneration if the Recreation Ground will be able to proceed, pending funding.

The sub-committee has a number of options for the site and are looking at the grants available. They are starting to realise that what they want will not be possible in one single project. What may happen is a phased plan that sees new equipment introduced to parts of the site with old equipment left in place until the next phase and a final phase of a general tidy up.

We are concerned that the regeneration will see an increase in the number of villagers using the site and that something has to be done with the lack of pavements from the village to the site – we have written to the EYRC about our concerns and we will keep you posted on our progress.

You may or may not agree with the Recreation Ground project or you might have view on how we can slow traffic down - if you do, you need to tell us.



David, who was a highly respected and active village resident, was also an experienced engineer and used to run his own engineering company. He was very interested in old machinery and I'm sure you will remember seeing him at many Wawne shows displaying such machinery.

He was very keen to promote engineering as a profession and ensure that skills training was given. He continued, until his sad passing, to be a member of engineering associations and was a very active member.

His family has provided, to the Wawne Fest Committee, a Memorial trophy in his name for which we are grateful.

The competition is open to all villagers and families (of all ages) or connected to the village i.e.school pupil. In keeping with David's love of engineering and technology, we would like you design and make, out of any material i.e. Lego (not a kit), metal, wood, plastic, wire..... a useful creative invention. This could be something to play with, a tool, a vehicle, a machine, a structure i.e an unusual bridge model etc. It may be static, have moving parts, wheels, electronics, lights etc. As you can see the design brief is very flexible so get thinking and creating. Its an excellent way of involving the whole family and building on skills.

There is no cost for entry. Entries will be judged and the winner awarded with the Trophy who will keep the cup until the next competition when it will be presented to the new winner.






